

OUR RAINY RIVER TEAM


As of November 30th, 2017, New Gold had 582 employees working at Rainy River!

72% are from the local region, **26%** self -identified as Indigenous and 14% were female!



- New Gold employs a Nurse Practitioner on site, which allows us immediate medical care for our workforce.
- New Gold has licensed operators who use UAV (Unmanned Aerial Vehicles) to monitor the environment and the progress of Rainy River.
- The New Gold Emergency Response Team conducted a joint exercise with the Township of Chapple in November and also provided assistance to the Chapple Fire Department at the Municipal landfill.


